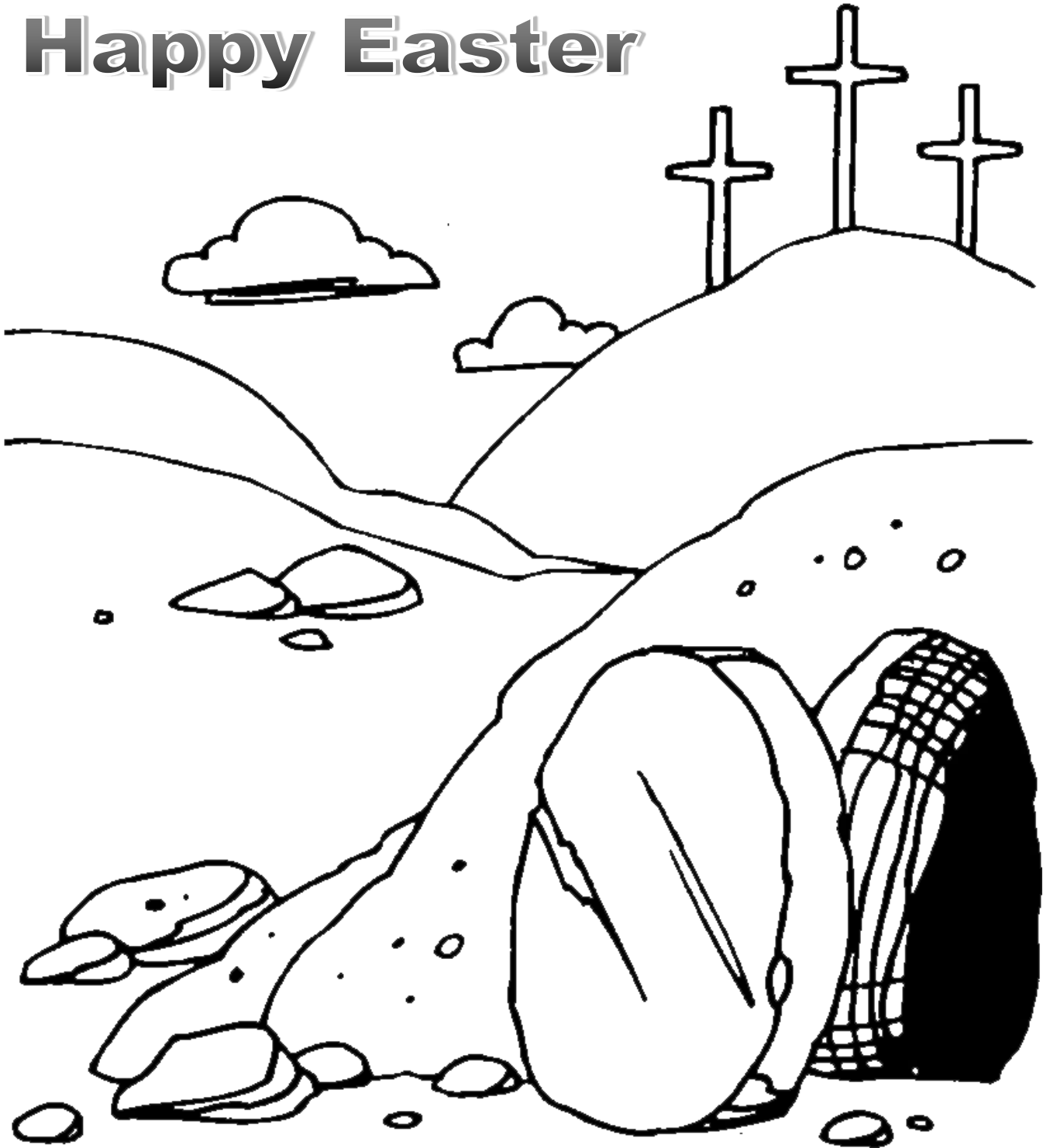

Bishop's letter by Ruth Worsley, Bishop of Taunton

'God is good... all the time!'

When I was a priest in Nottingham, I remember thinking that as a parish we seemed to reflect more of the story of the crucifixion of Christ rather than His resurrection. Ours was a parish which had many personal stories of loss and suffering, of challenge and trial, and sometimes this made it difficult to lift our faces to the horizon to see the triumph and glory beyond the grave.

As we approach Easter, I want to encourage us to take time to 'walk the way of the cross', to notice God's grace as we do so, even in the painful moments as well as keeping our eyes fixed on the coming glory.

As I write this, I am catching glimpses of the kingfisher on its perch outside my study window. Always a delight! It sits on the branch across the moat in stillness, watching for the sign of a fish before it suddenly dives and then crests the water with its prize. A splash of colour rarely seen by many. It fills me with hope and joy, two gifts which I think Easter inspires.

Walking through Lent we are continually called to become conscious of our mortality and are reminded of the price Jesus paid on our behalf. Giving himself in death that we might have life. And we have that life because his death was not the end but the beginning of a new chapter, of life in all its fulness.

So, whatever the circumstances of your life this Easter, allow yourself to fully recognise and experience the challenges but never lose the prospect of the glory to come! 'God is good... all the time!'

NEW ELECTORAL ROLL 2025 ST LAWRENCE'S, CUCKLINGTON and ST ANDREW'S, STOKE TRISTER WITH BAYFORD

WHAT IS THE ELECTORAL ROLL?

The Electoral Roll is the register of voting members of our two churches, St Lawrence's and St Andrew's. It is a register of those entitled to vote at the Annual Parochial Church Council.

EVERY 6 YEARS WE ARE REQUIRED TO PREPARE A COMPLETELY NEW ELECTORAL ROLL, EVEN IF YOU ARE ON THE EXISTING ROLL IT IS NECESSARY TO REAPPLY.

WHO CAN BE ON THE ELECTORAL ROLL?

Baptised residents in the villages who are:

members of the Church of England or a Church in communion with the Church of England;
over 16 years old, *(those who will be 16 during the next 12 months can be entered on their next birthday);*

Or

non resident but have worshipped here regularly for the last six months *(or who would have attended had ill health not prevented them).*

If you are eligible and wish to support St Lawrence's and St Andrew's please complete the form that will be delivered to you (please feel free to photocopy if more copies needed) and place in the box in either church porch (additional copies of the application form will also be available there)

The Salisbury and Shaftesbury Car Club Ltd with Devizes & District Motor Club are organising this motoring event in accordance with the Motor Vehicles (Competitions and Trials) Regulations and the General Regulations of the Motorsport UK (the British governing body of motor sport).

The clubs will be supporting the Dorset & Somerset Air Ambulance among other charities with a significant donation from funds. In addition, CO₂ emissions from the event will be balanced by a contribution to 'Tree-It' an accredited carbon balancing company.

The event is an Historic Road Rally for cars generally between 25 and 60 years old. There will be a maximum of 60 cars. It is a navigational rally, not a speed event and competing cars and drivers are subject to all the normal rules of the road (including insurance) when on the public highway.

Historic rallies are permitted by the Department for Transport under the provisions contained in Section 13 of the Road Traffic Act 1988 and detailed in the Motor Vehicles (Competitions and Trials) Regulations. In seeking authorisation the relevant authorities have been notified in accordance with the legislation.

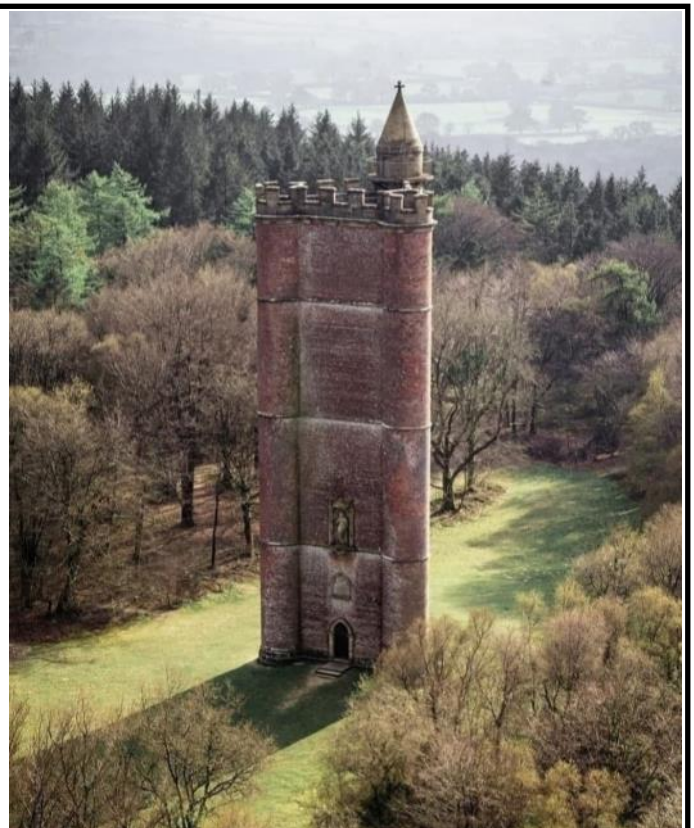

CHARLTON MUSGROVE CHURCH ELECTORAL ROLL 2025

Our Church Electoral Roll is the register of voting members of Charlton Musgrove parish.

The preparation of a new roll involves all existing members who have to reapply and is an opportunity to encourage those new to church life, or to the community, to join the roll, as a practical symbol of commitment to the church. It allows us to take part in decisions which affect the church and parish, to take part in the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM), and to stand for the Parochial Church Council.

Those eligible to be on the Roll are baptised residents in the parish aged 16 or over (or who will be 16 in the next 12 months) who are members of the Church of England (or of a Church in communion with the Church of England) OR baptised non-residents who have worshipped here regularly in the last 6 months.

Forms will be available in both churches and will be delivered to all who are on the current Roll. Please return completed forms to either church or to PCC members or Jean Sellick at The Bakery in Barrow Lane by 4th May 2025.
